KEYNOTE ADDRESS:**Guidelines for assessing knowledge maturity of organisations****Dr CJ Kruger - University of Pretoria (UP)**

Dr Kruger is a senior lecturer at UP, presenting primarily postgraduate courses in MBA, MEM (Engineering), MPM (Project Management), MIT, MCom, and MPhil programmes. He has more than fourteen years managerial experience in the ICT sector (ten years in mobile communications, ICT project management and four years in strategic ICT management). He participated in the formulation/ revision of SADF and SA Air Force Strategic Business Plans regarding ICT and knowledge as strategic resources. Dr Kruger holds a PhD in IT and both MBA and MIT degrees (with distinction) from UP, as well as a National Higher Diploma in Engineering from the Tshwane University of Technology. He is a member of the Association of Professional Managers of South Africa, a contributing member of the Performance Measurement Association (PMA) Cranfield School of Management – UK, and an Emerald Group Literati Club Member and Emerald author.

Developing a knowledge management strategy: a practical approach**Mr Roland Wagner - i-Kno Knowledge Solutions**

Mr Wagner is employed as a KM Specialist at i-Kno Knowledge Solutions where he develops and implements KM strategies for the Film and Publications Board and DST. He mentors and coaches clients through business analyses and alignment of KM with the overall organisational strategy. Mr Wagner also peer assists, conducts after action reviews and helps with benchmarking organisational and departmental processes. Mr Wagner has an MPhil Information and KM from the University of Stellenbosch.

Dr Omwoyo Bosire Onyanha is a senior lecturer at the Dept of Information Science. He holds a bachelors degree from Moi University, Kenya, where he studied information science, IT, archives, records management, publishing and book trade. He holds masters and doctoral degrees from the University of Zululand. Presently, he lectures, inter alia, library and information technology and information & KM. Dr Onyanha coordinates the teaching of the 'research article' at the honours level and supervises several masters and doctoral students.

Knowledge management in organisations: a practical view of the alignment between business strategy and KM tools and techniques**Dr Deonie Botha - BioPAD**

Dr Deonie Botha is responsible for KM at BioPAD, Pretoria. BioPAD is one of three Regional Biotechnology Innovation Centres that was established to build the knowledge economy in South Africa through biotechnology. The international biotechnology and pharmaceutical industries are generally regarded as the most developed in terms of CI. One of her long-term strategic objectives is to establish a CI capability in the biotechnology space in SA. Previously, she was part of the CI team of Kumba Iron Ore. Dr Botha was instrumental in developing basic and advanced CI courses for the University of Pretoria and has lectured KM and CI for many years. She has presented and published extensively both locally and internationally on the topic of CI.

Cost analysis and the effective management of records throughout their life cycle**Prof Patrick Ngulube - UNISA**

Prof Ngulube is Professor of Information Science at UNISA. He has extensive experience in records, archives and disaster management. He consulted with Mr B Abbot from the UN International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda regarding information and KM. Prof Ngulube is a rated NRF researcher and has done extensive editorial work for various journals of information science. He has published numerous articles in scientific journals. Prof Ngulube worked for seventeen years as a records manager at the National Archives of Zimbabwe. He lectured archives and records management at the Harare Polytechnic College from 1995-2000 and at UKZN from 2000-2007.

Mr Ramabina is an audio-visual archivist at the eTV. Previously he was employed as librarian at the Constitutional Court and the University of Venda.
